Example: Municipal fire departments provide free smoke detectors on availability basis. SKYC will be the resource to disseminate grant opportunities to local organizations.

Two update/refresher courses per year will be offered to current CPS technicians/instructors to maintain certification and to update on best practices.</li> <li>CSS Distribution: Wellspan CHI will coordinate a discounted car seat program for parents/guardians meeting eligibility requirements. Pending available funding, vouchers for free seats will be distributed to parents through member agencies.</li> <li>Check Up Events: Ten community events will be held annually to include car seat checks, parent info and discounted car seats.</li> <li>Workshops: SKYC will provide educational workshops that will provide continuing education to health care professionals, child care providers and parents.</li> <li>Enforcement: In addition to workshops, enforcement efforts will include distribution of a guide to PA car seat laws and best practices to law enforcement and pediatrician/ family practice offices.</li> </ul>

SKYC will also provide culturally appropriate pedestrian safety announcements to local media, including newsprint, radio and television.</li> <li>School Safety Committees: SKYC will provide technical</li> </ul>

At least one SKYC member shall reside on the Child Death Review team and act as a liaison of SKYC injury prevention activities.</li> <li>In-depth Case Study: The SKYC representative for Child Death Review shall inform (when information is not protected) the mechanism of child death as it relates to injury prevention.</li> <li>Quarterly Reports: SKYC collaborating agencies will submit a quarterly activity report identify injury prevention activities, materials distributed and participant demographics.</li> </ul>
